of all ages. We just try to find a job for everyone.”
Groups from across the area join in, too.

“Home Base came out, kind of a co-op, and washed cups for me, stuffed them for Cup of Cheer, and helped prepare the big Christmas baskets. Young people can do the heavy lifting better than we can,” she joked.

Their teamwork shows. Pictures on the website feature smiling children packing boxes, Boy Scouts who recently built a ramp, and volunteers in every corner of the space offering help where it’s needed most.

“You don’t see anyone grumbling out here,” Hunt said. “They’re glad to be here. And they work so hard.”

How It All Began

Hunt has been with Operation Blessing for roughly ten years. Before that, she worked 32 years for DHS. Retirement didn’t last long.

“I didn’t like retirement too much,” she admitted. “So I came down here, and... it was just wonderful.”

Operation Blessing has expanded steadily since then. What used to be two shopping days per month is now seven, made possible entirely by community donations. The organization has also received grants for improvements, including heating, air conditioning, storage units, and a much-needed building expansion.

“People worked out there in the heat and cold for years,” Hunt said. “The community has helped us grow and helped us keep up.”

Cup of Cheer: A Simple Gift That Matters

One story captures the heart behind the Cup of Cheer. A man visited Hunt recently and told her he and his girlfriend planned to walk around the beautifully lit Perry square on Christmas Eve.

“I said, ‘Well, get yourself a Christmas mug,’” Hunt recalled. “And he said, ‘Could I take one for my girlfriend? That way we’d each have a gift.’”

It’s small moments like this, tiny bits of warmth, that keep the project going. This year, Hunt not only hands them out to shoppers but also delivers some to home-bound residents.

“That was one of my favorite memories last Christmas,” she said. “Just taking cups of cheer to people who couldn’t get out.”

And this week, she had another idea.

“I thought, why am I not putting some in the Blessing Box outside?” she said with a smile. “So now I will.”

Need a Ride? They’ll Help with That, Too.

Transportation has become another area of support. Many residents walk or bicycle, making it tough to carry food home. “So we worked with the transit,” Hunt explained, referencing Cherokee Transit. “Now I can get people here once a month to shop or get food or help with utilities. It’s been wonderful.”

Hunt recommends contacting her first so she can provide a short orientation.

HOW TO SEARCH AND CLAIM
UNCLAIMED PROPERTY

1. Visit **yourmoney.ok.gov**
2. **SUBMIT A CLAIM.** Review selected properties, enter all information requested and confirm the address.
3. **COMPLETE YOUR CLAIM.** Review and gather documentation requirements and submit documentation.
4. **TRACK CLAIM PROGRESS.** Type in your claim ID number to track the progress of your claim instantly (allow up to 90 days for an auditor to be assigned to your claim).

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
