REGULAR MEETING
THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NOBLE COUNTY, STATE OF OKLAHOMA, met this day in the office of the Noble County Commissioners. Present were Chairman, Jason Kienholz, County Commissioner District #1; Vice-Chairman, Gary May, County Commissioner District #2; and Secretary, Connie Smith, County Clerk.

Also present were: Chris Landes, Asst. District Attorney; April Leslie, District 2 Assistant; Matt McGuire, Sheriff; Jaime Thompson, Assessor; Jim Smith, Emergency Manager; Brenda Landes, Election Board Secretary; and Keb Lehenbauer.

Chairman Kienholz called the regular meeting to order.

The minutes of the January 12, 2026 regular meeting were approved as read. The motion carried. Kienholz, aye; May, aye.

Announcements and Reports from County Commissioners about work in their Districts.

Finished replacing brakes on lowboy trailer and cleaned the shop.

The Morrison Band Boosters support band programs and events for students throughout the school year.

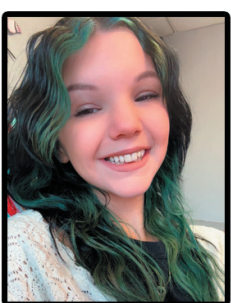
