 met this day in the office of  
 the Noble County Commissioners.  
 Present were Chairman, Ja-  
 son Kienholz, County Com-  
 missioner District #1; Member, Nick  
 Hughes, County Commissioner  
 District #3; and Secretary, Con-  
 nie Smith, County Clerk.
