# Affiliated pharmacies to pay over \$150K for False **Claims Act allegations**

Multiple Oklahoma pharmacies have agreed to pay \$157,000 to settle allegations that they billed the Oklahoma Medicaid Program, SoonerCare, for hundreds of unauthorized over-the-counter COVID-19

Apothecary Pharmacy, Cornwell Pharmacy, Cushing Family Pharmacy, R.T.'s Family Discount

Drug, Tiger Drug, Yale Drug, Jones Drug Store, and Swipht Pharmacy agreed to the settlement after an investigation by Oklahoma Attorney General Gentner Drummond's Medicaid Fraud Control Unit.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 361 REGARDING REGULATIONS ON TOBACCO PRODUCT USE WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF JAY, OKLAHOMA.
