## Fireworks tax-free weekend bill for America’s 250th filed

Rep. Kevin Norwood (R-Owasso) has filed legislation to create a temporary sales tax exemption on fireworks as Oklahoma and the nation prepare to celebrate the 250th anniversary of the United States.

House Bill 4093 would establish a four-day, tax-free period for the sale of fireworks beginning at 12:01 a.m. on July 2, and ending at midnight on July 5. The exemption is intended to coincide with Independence Day celebrations marking America’s semiquincentennial.

“This is a historic milestone for our country, and it deserves to be celebrated in a big way,” Norwood said. “Fireworks are part of how families and communities come together on Independence Day, and this bill helps make it easier for all Oklahomans to celebrate with a tax-free weekend.”

The measure defines fireworks as any combustible or explosive item sold

to the general public for producing a visible or audible effect, and directs the Oklahoma Tax Commission to promulgate rules necessary to implement the exemption.

Norwood said the legislation is meant to honor the nation’s history while encouraging shared moments of celebration.

“There is something special about watching fireworks on the Fourth of July,” Norwood said. “They represent joy, freedom, and the sacrifices that made this country possible, and I want families across Oklahoma to fully enjoy that experience as we mark 250 years of independence.”

If approved, the bill would take effect July 1, ensuring the exemption is in place for the Independence Day holiday period. HB4093 is eligible for consideration in the Second Regular Session of the 60th Legislature, which convenes Feb. 2.

Town of West Siloam Springs Sales Tax Ordinance of2026 or as West Siloam Springs Ordinance Number 2026-01-01, and the same shall be codified and incorporated into the Code of Ordinances of the Town of West Siloam Springs, Oklahoma as new law with this section being numbered §34.090 and each successive section hereafter shall be numbered sequentially as §34.091, §34.092, §34.093, etc.

Section 2. Tax Imposed. There is hereby imposed an excise tax of one percent (1.0%) (in addition to any and all other excise taxes now in force) to be levied upon the gross proceeds or gross receipts derived from all sales taxable under the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code.

Section 3. Purpose of Revenues. It is hereby declared to be the purpose of this Ordinance to provide revenues for the support of the functions of municipal government of the Town of West Siloam Springs, Oklahoma, including but not limited to street and road improvements throughout the Town, associated infrastructure, and associated personnel costs.

Section 4. Effective Date. The provisions of this Ordinance and the collection of the excise tax referenced herein shall become effective, subject to approval by a majority of the qualified electors of the Town voting on the same in the manner prescribed by law, on the 1st day of October, 2026.

Section 5. Subsisting State Permits. All valid and subsisting permits to do business issued by the Oklahoma Tax Commission pursuant to the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code are, for the purposes of this Ordinance, hereby ratified, confirmed and adopted in lieu of

any requirement for an additional Town permit for the same purpose.

Section 6. Payment of Tax. The tax herein levied shall be paid to the Tax Collector at the time and in the manner and form prescribed for payment of the state sales tax under the State Tax Law of the State, of Oklahoma.

Section 7. This Tax in Addition to Taxes Currently Levied; Administrative Procedures. The tax levied hereby is in addition to any and all other excise taxes levied or assessed by the City pursuant to existing ordinances (the “Prior Ordinances”); provided, however, that those provisions of said Prior Ordinances relating to Definitions; Tax Collector Defined; Classification of Taxpayers; Subsisting State Permits; the portion of Tax Rate - Sales Subject to Tax, pertaining to Sales Subject to Tax (not rate of Tax); the provisions of said Prior Ordinances regarding Exemptions and Other Exempt Transfers; the provisions of said Prior Ordinances regarding Tax Due When--Returns--Records; the portion of said, Prior Ordinances regarding tax constituting debt; Vendor's Duty to Collect Tax; Returns and Remittances - Discounts; Interest and Penalties--Delinquency; Waiver of Interest and Penalties; Erroneous Payments--Claim for Refund; Fraudulent Returns; and Records Confidential shall apply to the excise tax levied and assessed by this Ordinance. For purposes of this Ordinance, references in Prior Ordinances, to specific provisions of the Oklahoma Statutes shall be deemed to be references to said statutory provisions, as amended.

Section 8. Amendments. The people of the Town of West Siloam Springs, Oklahoma, by their approval of this Ordinance at the election hereinabove provided

for, hereby authorize the Town by Ordinance duly enacted to make such administrative and technical changes or additions in the method and manner of administration and enforcing this Ordinance as may be necessary or proper for efficiency and fairness or in order to make the same consistent with the Oklahoma Sales Tax Code, as amended, except that the rate of the tax herein provided for shall not be changed without approval of the qualified electors of the Town as provided by law.

Section 9. Provisions Cumulative. The provisions hereof shall be cumulative and in addition to any and all other taxing provisions of Town Ordinances.

Section 10. Severability. The provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and if any part or provision hereof shall be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such adjudication shall not affect or impair any of the remaining parts or provisions hereof.

Section 11. Emergency. It is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the Town of West Siloam Springs, Oklahoma and the inhabitants thereof that said additional excise tax be levied for the purposes set out herein and that provisions of this Ordinance become operative immediately by the calling and holding of an election and that an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately from and after its passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.
