No refunds will be made for bidding documents or specification books purchased.

Bids must be prepared in accordance with the State Standard Specifications. When written bids are allowed, sealed proposals may be delivered directly to the Office Engineer Division prior to the scheduled bid opening. For written bids, do not disassemble the bidding proposal in any way.

Any firm bidding a project as a joint venture, that has not been previously approved by the department, must complete the "Request for Joint Venture" form, which is posted on the ODOT website, prior to bidding. Unless otherwise specified in the proposal, all bids must be submitted with a proposal guaranty equal to 5% of the bid total.

Bids submitted earlier than ninety-six (96) hours before the Bid Opening will be rejected and returned unopened. Upon receipt at the specified time, all bids will be carefully examined to ensure they are complete and accurate. All construction work and materials provided must adhere strictly to the Contract Documents prepared by Cimarron Valley Engineering, LLC.

BID SECURITY AND BONDING
Each bidder must submit their bid accompanied by a certified or cashier's check from a solvent Oklahoma bank or a Bidder's Bond in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the bid amount.
