

SCHOLARSHIPS**AVAILABLE TO OKLAHOMA****HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS**

Registration is now open for the Oklahoma Hall of Fame's annual Oklahoma Scholarship Competition. This competition offers high school students across the state the opportunity to earn money for college. More than \$770,000 in cash scholarships and tuition grants are available.

Each year, students in grades 9 through 12 compete in the Oklahoma Scholarship Competition, which tests their knowledge of Oklahoma's history, geography, and its people. The competition consists of a one-hour, online exam administered in March. Students compete against other high schoolers in their county. The top scorers in each county are awarded either a cash scholarship or a tuition grant to an accredited Oklahoma college or university. At least 10 scholarships are available in every county. In 2025, 130 students received scholarships.

"All year long, the Oklahoma Hall of Fame tells the stories of incredible Oklahomans to inspire future generations," said Gini Moore Campbell, vice president at the Oklahoma Hall of Fame. "The Oklahoma Scholarship Competition provides financial support to empower our state's high school students to pursue higher education. We are proud to provide resources that equip students from rural and urban areas alike to make a positive impact."

Students must pre-register for the competition on the Oklahoma Hall of Fame website by 5 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 27. Information about competition requirements, available scholarships, and how to prepare for the test can also be found on the website. The testing window will be open from Friday, March 6 to Sunday, March 22.

Scholarship recipients will be invited to attend the Scholarship Awards Assembly on Wednesday, April 22, at the Gaylord-Pickens Museum. **Scams targeting older adults**

The Oklahoma Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program is alerting residents of nursing homes, assisted living centers, and residential care facilities, along with their families and staff, to be vigilant against scams that disproportionately target older adults – especially during winter months when isolation can increase vulnerability. Scammers often exploit trust, loneliness, or urgency to steal money, personal information, or gain access to accounts.

Common tactics include government impersonation (fake IRS or Social Security calls threatening arrest), tech support fraud (pop-up alerts claiming computer viruses and demanding remote access), grandparent/emergency scams (pretending to be a relative in distress needing money), romance scams, and fraudulent Medicare or investment offers. With the rise of AI, voice-cloning scams mimicking family members are also increasing. If you feel pressured or have any doubt, reach out for help from authorities.

Winter challenges like post-holiday

isolation, colder weather limiting outings, and heightened financial concerns (e.g., tax season echoes) can make residents more susceptible. Facilities should promote awareness through postings, discussions, and resident councils.

"Older adults in long-term care are valued members of our communities and deserve protection from those who prey on their goodwill," said William Whited, State Long-Term Care Ombudsman. "We urge facilities to educate residents and staff on red flags—like unsolicited calls demanding payment or personal details—and encourage reporting suspicions immediately. Never share financial information over the phone or send money to unknown parties."

Key tips to avoid scams:

- Verify Calls: Government agencies like IRS or Social Security do not demand immediate payment via gift cards, wire transfers, or crypto.
- Tech Alerts: Ignore pop-ups or unsolicited "tech support" calls;

legitimate companies don't contact you this way.

- Emergency Claims: Verify family emergencies directly with known contacts.
- Heating and Comfort: Ensure adequate warmth to reduce isolation-related risks.
- Emotional Support: Combat post-holiday loneliness through activities and visitation to lower vulnerability.

Ombudsmen investigate and resolve complaints, promote residents' rights, and improve care and quality of life statewide. If you know someone living in a long-term care facility that may need an advocate or if you are interested in becoming a volunteer advocate, more volunteers are needed for this area and throughout the state. The State Ombudsman staff offers virtual training for new volunteers throughout the year.
