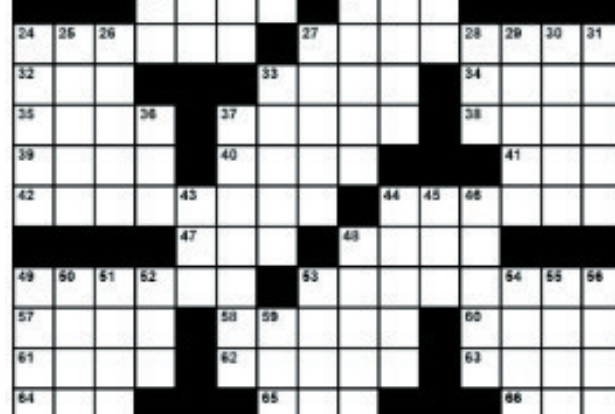

Rotary Club hears update on historic Elite Hotel redevelopment

Perry's Rotary Club had the regular luncheon meeting on Monday, June 29th at Perry Golf & Country Club.

Rotarian Kristen McCaul called the meeting to order beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a prayer by Rotarian Reverend Doctor Joshua Bell then in unison the group sang the first verse of America.

Reverend Doctor Joshua Bell, of Brother Bell's BBQ. Bell announced the restaurant will have Grand Opening on July 4th.

Following Rotarian Kristen's introduction, Royce and Crystal Stephens shared plans for their new venture, D Street Bakes and Coffee, which is taking shape in the historic former Elite Hotel building on the north side of the Perry Square. The renovated

building will house three separate businesses under one roof. Upon entering the main doors, visitors will find D Street Bakes and Coffee, featuring a comfortable seating area on the east side. Royce also announced plans for D Street Gun Shop, a longtime dream he intends to pursue after retiring from the Perry Police Department following 35 years of honorable service. The third component, D Street Retreat, will offer three Airbnb accommodations—a one-bedroom, two-bedroom, and three-bedroom suite. The larger suites will feature full kitchens, and all lodging will occupy the building's upper floor with a separate entrance from the coffee shop.

Crystal explained that while excitement continues to build, no grand opening or firm opening date has been set, as construction remains dependent on

contractors' schedules. The gallery area at the rear of the building will continue to serve as a meeting space and provide overflow seating for the coffee shop once opened.

Restoring the building has been a labor of love, requiring significant time, investment, and dedication. Originally constructed in 1893 as the last wooden building on the square, it underwent a major renovation in 1936. Today, the Stephens are carefully blending the building's historic character with modern functionality, incorporating antique materials alongside contemporary updates.

In addition to specialty coffee, D Street Bakes and Coffee will serve breakfast and lunch, featuring a custom coffee roast supplied by an Oklahoma City distributor. During the question-and-answer

session, the possibility of future outdoor seating was discussed. Stephens said the idea has been considered but will ultimately depend on local zoning and code requirements.

The D Street Gun Shop is estimated to

open in September and will have new and used firearms they will also have the option for trade and consignment and reasonably priced ammunition.

The group then recited the 4-Way Test, and the meeting was adjourned.

Perry man faces manslaughter charge in fatal Highway 177 crash

A Perry man is facing a first-degree manslaughter charge after authorities allege he was driving under the influence of illegal

drugs when he caused a head-on collision that ultimately claimed the life of a Stillwater woman.

Charles Mary Cooper, 43, of Perry, could face up to life in prison if convicted of the charge filed by Payne County Acting District Attorney Jose Villarreal. Cooper remains in the Payne County Jail on a \$250,000 bond pending a preliminary hearing scheduled for July 6.

According to an affidavit filed by Oklahoma Highway Patrol Trooper Matt Stacy, the crash occurred on Oct. 22, 2025, on U.S. Highway 177 north of Stillwater, approximately one-quarter mile north of Lone Chimney Road.

Investigators allege Cooper was driving a 2006 Chevrolet 3500 flatbed truck northbound when the vehicle crossed the

centerline and struck a southbound 2018 Ford Escape driven by Megan Carter. The impact tore the flatbed from the truck's frame as it traveled along the driver's side of the Ford Escape.

The affidavit states the Ford Escape then left the roadway, rolled over and came to rest on its roof. Carter was partially ejected during the collision.

After the initial collision, the Chevrolet 3500 continued northbound before colliding head-on with a southbound 2025 Chevrolet 2500 driven by Jesus Hernandez Alvaredo. Both vehicles left the roadway and came to rest west of Highway 177.

Carter sustained severe injuries and was transported to St. John Medical Center in Tulsa, where she was admitted in

critical condition. She remained hospitalized until her death on Nov. 12, 2025, nearly three weeks after the crash.

Cooper was airlifted to OU Medical Center and admitted in critical condition. Hernandez Alvaredo suffered minor injuries and was treated and released at the scene.

According to the affidavit, investigators obtained a search warrant for Cooper's vehicle and discovered a green plastic bottle containing a glass smoking pipe, as well as a small clear glass container containing a powdery residue that tested positive for methamphetamine.

The affidavit further alleges Cooper's blood samples tested positive for amphetamine and methamphetamine. Fentanyl was also detected, though investigators noted the substance was

administered as part of lifesaving medical treatment following the collision.

Authorities also allege Cooper did not possess a valid driver's license at the time of the crash. Court documents state his Oklahoma driver's license expired on Nov. 30, 2024, and that he also held a suspended driver's license issued by the state of Missouri.

"The investigation concluded that Charles Cooper was committing the misdemeanor crimes of operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of illegal substances and operating a vehicle without a valid driver's license when he crossed the centerline, causing the collision that resulted in the death of Megan Carter," the affidavit states.

The case remains pending in Payne County District Court.
