# ETHICS COMMISSION RESTORES OLD REPORTING SYSTEM, EYES RECOVERY FROM COMPANY

What’s old is new again, at least when it comes to keeping tabs on political campaigns and lobbyist activities in Oklahoma.

Ending months of near-darkness amid a now-defunct shift to a new database built by a Texas vendor, the Oklahoma Ethics Commission relaunched its original Guardian System on Dec. 19 after voting “to terminate the contract with RFD and Associates Inc.” and “to retain the Attorney General’s Office to determine what legal and equitable remedies if any we can pursue.”

The decision means the public and those regulated by the commission can again visit Guardian.ok.gov to review or submit campaign finance filings, lobbyist registrations and other information.

“Our responsibility is to administer Oklahoma’s campaign-finance laws accurately, lawfully, and transparently

— especially during an election season,” executive director Lee Anne Bruce Boone said in a brief press release.

During the Dec. 19 meeting, Bruce Boone presented commissioners with background about how RFD and Associates met “none” of the project deadlines for Guardian 2.0’s launch. After commissioners voted to terminate the company’s contract and review whether the state can recover any of the \$825,000 already paid on the failed project, RFD chief operating officer Scott T. Glover frowned as he left the State Capitol and declined to answer questions. “I don’t have any comments right now,” Glover said.

Meanwhile, the commission received a smattering of public feedback about proposed rule changes, which would increase cash contribution limits, add new reporting requirements for so-called “dark money” organizations and modify other guidelines. No action was taken on the proposed changes Dec. 19.

Modoc Nation is seeking  
qualifications from qualified

contractors for the complete construction of a Training Community Building located at 10051 S 608 Rd, Miami, OK 74354. The project outputs include an 11,625 sq ft facility with a 250 sq ft interior safe room, a 1,200 sq ft sidewalk, and 1,000 sq yds of car parking, featuring a wood frame, brick siding, and vinyl windows. Interested parties are to provide bids to furnish all labor, quality control, materials, supplies, and supervision to complete the project. All bids from General Contractors shall be whole and assume all sub-contracts and divisions of labor. The project must be completed within the agreed number of calendar days starting from the Notice to Proceed issued by Modoc Nation.

This project is federally funded by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) through Indian Housing Block Grants under the ICDBG program. The Awarded Contractor must comply with all applicable laws, federal regulations, and requirements relating to these federal funds, including the specific ICDBG requirements found at 24 CFR Part 1003. Indian Preference: In accordance with Section 7(b) of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 450e(b)) and HUD regulations at 24 CFR §1003.510, all ICDBG projects are subject to Indian preference in employment, training, and contracting. Drug-Free and Tobacco-Free Workplace: All Modoc Nation buildings and grounds are considered drug-free and tobacco-free. The successful bidder shall ensure all employees, subcontractors, and other workers comply with this policy.

Build America, Buy America (BABA): This project is subject to the Buy America Preference under the Build America, Buy America Act (2 CFR Part 184) and HUD guidance. The Contractor shall ensure that all iron and steel products and specified construction materials used in the project are produced in the United States unless an authorized waiver applies. If HUD determines that this project qualifies for an applicable waiver, including a general tribal waiver or a project-specific waiver, the Buy America Preference requirements shall be waived to the extent authorized by HUD. The Contractor shall cooperate with the Owner in documenting the basis for any waiver and maintain such documentation for at least three years after project completion.

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers – Tulsa District (USACE) will inspect the project design, estimate, and construction, and review pay applications for the Owner’s recommendation to pay.

Modoc Nation reserves the right to select a Design-Build team from the responses, with or without conducting interviews. A Design-Build team will be notified with an Intent to Negotiate to produce design documents up to 35%, a guaranteed maximum price estimate, and a construction schedule prior to a fully negotiated contract. Assumptions and clarifications are to be included in the 35% contract package. If pricing and scope cannot be negotiated, Modoc Nation may release the Design-Build team and move to another contractor. The Design-Build contractor assumes risk before a fully executed contract and will fully ensure the project until the keys are handed over to the Owner. # Representative targets school library material standards

Rep. Chris Banning (R-Bixby) filed legislation prohibiting obscene materials in Oklahoma public school libraries. House Bill 2978 would update state law governing school library media programs by prohibiting the acquisition of materials that meet Oklahoma’s legal definition of obscenity. Banning said the measure removes “references to subjective community standards and instead

relies on established statute, creating a consistent statewide framework for school library decisions.” “This legislation provides a straightforward statewide rule that helps ensure school libraries stay within the definition of education. According to Black’s Law Dictionary, education is defined as providing proper moral, intellectual, and physical instruction,”

Banning said. Under HB2978, school districts would follow the existing legal definition of obscenity outlined in Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes when acquiring library materials. Banning says this approach reduces confusion, limits conflict, and gives administrators clear direction while “preserving the innocence of our youth.”
