On the 2nd day of February 2026, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Perry, Oklahoma, approved Ordinance No. 2026-02 that establishes a flat \$3.00/month fee per developed tract, restricts use of collected funds to stormwater projects, and requires annual council review as part of the budget process. It will also update the stormwater utility billing to incorporate Equivalent Service Units (ESUs) based on impervious surface for applicable tracts and establishes a stormwater development fee structure for growth-related impacts, including a credit system for qualifying land/improvements. Perry Council approves water line project, reviews consent items, and city operations

The Perry City Council approved a major water line project, addressed questions regarding consent agenda items and heard updates on city operations during its regular meeting Feb. 2.

Early in the meeting, council members removed several items from the consent agenda to request clarification. One item involved a \$20,785 engineering invoice from Cimarron Valley Engineering for January services. Council members said they wanted clearer descriptions of the work performed and how the charges aligned with previously approved projects.

City staff explained that consent agenda items are intended for routine, noncontroversial matters and may include invoices covering multiple projects. Officials said invoices are reviewed internally, tracked by project, and approved within the city manager’s spending authority, which is capped at \$50,000 unless otherwise directed by the council. Staff agreed to continue providing more detailed descriptions when possible.

Council members also discussed the nomination of Darren Hughes as Region 1 director for the Oklahoma Rural Water Association. Staff said the organization is relatively new to the city’s agenda and has become more prominent as the city works closely with regional water partners. While expressing no objection to the nomination, council members said they would like more information in future years and possibly explore encouraging local participation.

Another consent item — the declaration of surplus office furniture and equipment — was briefly discussed after council members noted the absence of a detailed list. Staff apologized and clarified the surplus items included two rolling office chairs, one leather chair and a non-functioning copier.

Following discussion, the council unanimously approved all items removed from the consent agenda.

During council reports, members said they had received numerous phone calls regarding the possible establishment of a downtown church. Council members also praised the city’s street department for its quick response to recent winter weather.

Several residents commented favorably on how quickly major streets were cleared after snowfall, council members said, noting the work helped keep travel safe.

City staff also reminded residents that homeowners who experience frozen or broken water lines during winter weather may be eligible for a one-time adjustment to their water bill. Residents must contact City Hall and submit repair receipts for review.

In the city manager’s report, officials said departmental budget reviews are underway as staff prepares for upcoming budget presentations this spring. The city manager also addressed recurring issues with street lighting along state highways, explaining that while the Oklahoma Department of Transportation installs some infrastruc-

Thomas said the department has completed certification on Burna launchers, which deploy pepper-filled projectiles using compressed air and provide officers with an additional tool beyond tasers.

The equipment was donated by a local resident, and most officers have now been trained and qualified. Supervisors will carry the devices on duty to ensure availability on each shift. Thomas said the equipment enhances officer and public safety by offering an effective option at greater distances than a taser.

City Manager Nate Read reported that remodeling work at the police department is progressing well and that negotiations with employee unions have begun.

Later in the meeting, the council discussed execution authority for an upcoming water line project contract. City officials said the mayor typically executes such agreements, though the council could authorize the city manager to administer the contract and provide periodic reports, as has been done on previous projects.

The council unanimously voted to award the water line kill project to Lone Hickory Cattle Company for \$675,510, contingent upon approval by the Oklahoma Water Resources Board. Council members requested a future agenda item to discuss broader administrative authorization for similar contracts.

With no further business, the council adjourned.

The Perry Municipal Authority and Perry Public Works Authority met immediately afterward. Both bodies approved their consent agendas unanimously and adjourned without additional discussion.
