May 29, members of the SkyRyders Drum and Bugle Corps checked in to the Kansas Army National Guard Armory in Hutchinson for a weekend camp.

The camp focused on visual technique, music, and tone quality so as to build a solid foundation for the season in July. The corps quickly adapted to thunderstorms by remaining indoors to practice sporadically throughout the weekend. When able, members would be instructed to form a block in the parking lot or out in the Don Michaels field in order to practice marching and posture in many different, unique ways. The corps also learned skills like jazz running and dance positions to be

fully capable of the planned show visuals. When inside, practice was primarily focused around the music. The corps' most technically complex piece is their second movement, which has a total of 4 different time signatures, complex rhythms, and unusual chords. This results in a unique sound and, combined with the stunning visuals, will grab the attention of the audience while on the field. On Sunday, weather was cooperative and allowed the corps to brush up on drill for movement one.

Each student's scholarship in the amount of \$28,000 for two years will be applied toward

tuition, fees, books, on-campus resident housing and meal plan. Applicants must maintain at least a 3.25 grade-point average per semester and enroll in 12 credit hours each semester in an associate degree program.

The Oklahoma Rising Scholar Scholarship, established by the state legislature and governor in 1988 and operated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, offers a full tuition waiver plus \$1,500.00 a semester to cover all major expenses for four years or eight semesters as long as the student attends an Oklahoma institution participating in the program.
