# Perry airport manager highlights growth, upgrades and future expansion to American Legion

Terence Hulet, manager of the Perry Municipal Airport, speaks to members of Ellis-Jirous American Legion Post 53 about recent improvements, future expansion, and the airport's role in supporting emergency services and regional aviation.

Hulet, who has overseen airport operations for approximately six years, noted that the Perry airport itself has been a fixture in the community for nearly eight decades. During his tenure, the facility has seen meaningful upgrades, including the installation of a new fueling system during the COVID-19 pandemic—an improvement fully funded by the Federal Aviation Administration.

He explained that most of the airport's existing hangars are privately owned and situated on leased land, with capacity to expand to as many as 38 hangars, along with the addition of drawing in a maintenance shop by the added expansion. Current development includes the

construction of a 50-by-200-foot hangar with 4 bays on the south end of the property, designed to accommodate four individual aircraft with further expansion of hangars on the remaining locations on both the North and South ends planned.

Highlighting the airport's capabilities, Hulet shared that the largest aircraft able to safely land at Perry Municipal Airport is a Citation Latitude, underscoring the facility's ability to accommodate mid-size business jets. He also noted that Life Flight services utilize the airport, providing critical emergency response for the area, while Vance Air Force Base and Oklahoma State University aircraft frequently conduct touch-and-go training, depending on student demand.

Despite ongoing development, demand continues to outpace availability, with a hangar waiting list already in place for hangar space yet to be built. The airport currently operates seven days a week from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., with after-hours access available and manned operation for a call-out fee.

In closing, Hulet noted with a touch of humor that while Perry's airport continues to grow, the addition of commercial air service would likely require a population increase of roughly 25,000 plus residents.
