ORDINANCE NO. 2026-2 AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET ACT AND AMENDING THE TOWN CODE AS TO BUDGETING AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF KETCHUM, OKLAHOMA:

Section 1: The Town of Ketchum hereby adopts the Municipal Budget Act set forth in Title 11 Oklahoma Statutes Sections 17-201 et. seq., as may be amended from time to time, which shall go into effect on July 1, 2026.
Section 2: Chapter 7, Article 2 of the Ketchum Town Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Article 2. Budget Section 7-22. Adoption of annual budget; appropriations. A. The board of trustees of the town shall follow the procedures set forth in the Municipal Budget Act, Oklahoma Statutes, Title 11, Sections 17-201 et. seq., as it may be amended from time to time, and any other applicable provisions of law.

Section 7-23. Transfer of appropriations balances. A. Transfer of appropriations balances and supplemental appropriations shall be made pursuant to the procedures set forth in the Municipal Budget Act, Oklahoma Statutes, Title 11, Sections 17-201 et. seq., as it may be amended from time to time, and any other applicable provisions of law.

Section 3: The current budget format shall continue through the end of fiscal year 2025-2026. The Town shall create the fiscal year 2026-2027 budget pursuant to the procedures set forth in the Municipal Budget Act and that budget shall take effect July 1, 2026.

Section 4: Any Ordinance or section of the Ketchum Town Code now in effect which conflicts with the provisions of this Ordinance is hereby repealed.

Section 5: EMERGENCY CLAUSE: It being immediately necessary for the preservation

of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist by reason whereof this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
