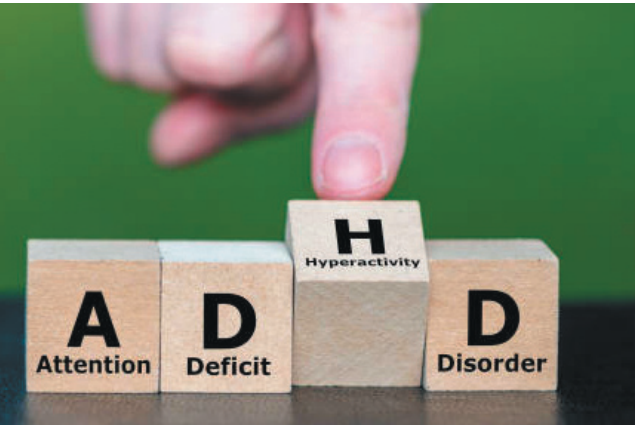

ADD or ADHD?

what sets them apart

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When people hear about attention difficulties, the terms ADD and ADHD are often used interchangeably, however, there is an important difference between them. ADD, or Attention Deficit Disorder, is an older term that was once used to describe individuals who struggled with focus, organization, and execution, but did not show signs of hyperactivity. People with ADD were often seen as daydreamers, forgetful, or easily distracted. While many still use the term informally, it is no longer recognized as an official diagnosis. Today, the medical community uses the term ADHD, which stands for Attention-

Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder. ADHD is considered a single condition that can look different in different people. What used to be called ADD is now classified as the inattentive presentation of ADHD, describing those who mainly experience challenges with attention rather than hyperactivity. Other individuals may show more restlessness and impulsivity, while some experience a combination of both. The change in terminology came about because experts wanted a clearer, unified diagnosis that included all the way attention-related difficulties can appear. ADHD now serves as the umbrella term that covers inattention, hyperactivity, and impulsivity in varying degrees. Even though people may still say ADD in casual conversation, the correct and current medical term is ADHD. In the end, ADD and ADHD describe the same condition, but ADHD is the official name, while ADD is the outdated term. Understanding this distinction helps reduce the confusion and ensures individuals receive the correct recognition and support for their needs.
