NYC ushers in new era

The year 2026 is going to be a year of big news, big controversies, and big changes in America.

This is the stuff of New Testament missionaries and world evangelism.

The mayor spoke with joyful eloquence and confidence about a new socialist city government uplifting everyone left behind in an old system of extravagant wealth for the privileged few and dismal poverty for people working to keep New York City running. 



And now to the applause of New York voters, socialism has its opportunity to prove there is a better future America to be built on socialistic collectivism replacing less government and meritocrat rewards of free enterprise.
